



Joyful Watercolor Sketching with Liesel Lund

Supplies:

Daniel Smith has put together specially priced kits which you can view here: <https://liesellund.com/materials-jws/> If you are getting your first watercolor set up, you may prefer these kits: <https://liesellund.com/jbw-materials/>

1. 140lb Watercolor Paper, cold or hot press. Hot press is smooth and easier to draw on, cold press makes better watercolor textures. I recommend trying each as my classes are often divided in which they prefer. Pads or blocks, ideally 8 x 5 or larger.
 - When you are ready to try really good paper, my favorite paper is Fabriano Artistic Extra White in soft press which is half way between hot and cold press. It only comes in large sheets. I also like Arches papers.
2. Brushes:
 - small round
 - medium round
 - large mop brush to do wet into wet (you won't need this if you are only going to do small paintings)
 - medium flat angle brush
3. Palette
4. Paper towels
5. 2 water containers, I use salsa jars
6. For sketching:
 - watersoluble pen (just test out the ones you have to see if they bleed when they get wet.)
 - permanent pen
 - pencil & eraser
7. Paint-What you get is up to you and your budget. On the links above I list two different set of recommended colors. If you already have paint, bring what you have. DO not use hard pan sets designed for kids.



The great thing about taking classes at the store is if you decide you need something-they should have it!
